



UNIFORM POLICY

School uniforms promote effective learning for all learners.

Our school policy regarding uniform:

We are committed to ensure that uniform is worn neatly and proudly.

The appearance of learners in uniform must promote the good public image of our school.

Wearing of a mask has become an important addition to our uniform: the school sells the face masks with the school emblem at a cost of R30. From term 2 – learners it is compulsory with learners to wear our school masks. Term 1 - Only plain black masks are allowed.

The black takkies should be completely black; if a learner wears a black takkie with more colours, the learner will be sent home.

UNIFORM POLICY

Principles governing the code:

En route to school and en route home, the school uniform must be worn correctly.

The complete school uniform must also be worn if instructed to do so when attending a function.

Learners may not wear part of the uniform with casual dress during week-ends or holidays.

School sports clothes are considered to be uniform and may be worn when travelling to play in a school match as per the instructions of the teacher-in-charge.

Learners must take pride in their uniform and ensure that it is neat, clean and in good repair. No graffiti or writing of any kind may appear on the school or sports uniform.

In the event of incorrect or lost items of uniform, a letter of explanation from a parent/guardian is to be given to the SMT. The Principal/Deputy Principal will assess the case and sign the letter to indicate the date by which the situation should be corrected. In the event of no letter being presented by the learner, the learner will be sent home immediately. Each case will be evaluated on merit.

No other t-shirts, cycling shorts or any other clothing item may be worn for it will be confiscated with a monetary fine of R100 for the item of clothing to be returned.

School tracksuit can be worn during winter for both girls and boys and also to any sporting or school events/excursions

The supplier of our school uniform is SUITS-U in Plumstead.

- Uniforms should not be tight fitted.
- Uniforms will be checked daily. Learners that do not comply with the uniform policy will be dealt with accordingly.

GIRLS UNIFORM:

Beige skirts/pants (Skirts - not shorter than 4 fingers above the knees).

GENERAL APPEARANCE OF LEARNERS

HAIR AND JEWELLERY REGULATIONS

BOYS

Hair to be neat and brushed

Facial hair must be kept neat and trimmed.

Chains to not be visible or it will be confiscated.

Facial and body piercings may not carry any form of earrings, stopper, bush bristle of any kind or retainer.

No earrings to be worn- will be confiscated.

Hair must be natural in colour – learners will be sent home to change colour back should learners come to school with white/red/orange or any other colour hair. Hair may be coloured to enhance the natural colour of the learner's hair. However, hair may not be coloured, colour rinsed, tinted, highlighted or dyed in any way that is vastly different to the learner's natural hair colour. Obvious highlights are not allowed. Peroxide or any other bleaching agent is not permitted.

Nails to be well cared for and kept short.

Tattoos are prohibited and any visible tattoos must be covered up at all times.

GIRLS

Hair must be kept neat and tidy using only black hair bands. Jewelry Must be worn to a minimum and confined to one ring, (signed ring), a wristwatch, one pair of earrings (studs, sleepers of eardrops only)

Facial and body piercings may not carry any form of earrings, stopper, bush bristle of any kind or retainer.

Hair may be coloured to enhance the natural colour of the learner's hair. Hair may not be coloured, colour rinsed, tinted, highlighted or dyed in any way that is vastly different to the learner's natural hair colour. Obvious highlights are not allowed. Peroxide or any other bleaching agent is not permitted.

Nails must be kept short and well cared for. Girls may only wear transparent, colourless nail-polish.

Tattoos are prohibited and any visible tattoos must be always covered up.

GENERAL

- There is to be no deviation from the above-mentioned regulations during extra-curricular participation.
- While the school will endeavor to keep the confiscated items safe until collected by the learner on a date provided by the school, Focus College bears no responsibility for the loss thereof.
- Learners are not allowed to cut any part of their school uniform unless done by a professional dressmaker or tailor in order to alter the size of the uniform.
- Girls may not use safety pins to alter the look of the school skirts and not shorter than 4 fingers above the knees.
- Unless a concession is specifically made by the SMT, learners are to wear full school uniform whenever they are present at school or travelling to and from school.
- Every Friday civvies and learners pay R10 should they come to school dressed in civvies as part of the school fundraiser.
- Uniform/Pants not too tight and revealing.
- Facial piercings, nose rings and lip rings not allowed on civvies days.
